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COLLEGE TRANSFER Pathway Quick Reference

Requirements:

✓ Junior or senior



- At least 3.0 weighted high school GPA (current official transcript required)

 Demonstrate "college readiness" on an approved test or tests.

 Eligibility may be demonstrated by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores from any of the approved assessments.
- ✓ Complete SCC paper application for high school students
- Textbooks and other required materials must be purchased by the student (or high school)
- Student/parent are responsible for transportation to / from seatbased classes

These pathways will allow a student to BEGIN working on Universal General Education Transfer Core (UGETC) classes. <u>Additional classes will be required to complete an associate's degree.</u>

When a student completes ALL courses in a pathway, he or she may take other classes required for the degree.

Students may be in a College Transfer Pathway AND a Career Technical Certificate, but NOT two College Transfer Pathways.

 $Courses \ may \ be \ taken \ in \ any \ order, \ except \ courses \ with \ required \ pre-requisites.$

No course substitutions are allowed.

To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must: (1) continue to make progress toward high school graduation and (2) maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework.

Provisional Status: A high school junior or senior who does not demonstrate college-readiness on an approved assessment or placement test may be provisionally enrolled in a College Transfer Pathway. To qualify for Provisional Status, a student must meet the following criteria:

- a. Have a cumulative weighted GPA of 3.5;
- b. Have completed two years of high school English with a grade of 'C' or higher:
- Have completed high school Algebra II (or a higher level math class) with a grade of 'C' of higher;
- d. Obtain the written approval of the high school principal or his/her designee; and,
- e. Obtain the written approval of the community college president or his/

A Provisional Status student may only register for college mathematics (MAT) and college English (ENG) courses within the chosen Pathway. To be eligible to register for other courses in the Pathway, the student must first successfully complete a mathematics or English course with a grade of 'C' or higher.

Required Class Arts and Science: ACA 122 College Transfer Success

OPTIONAL GENERAL EDUCATION HOURS (1-2 classes) - A student may take 1-2 foreign language courses designated as General Education in the CAA as a part of either College Transfer pathway. These courses are NOT a part of the UGETC. Students who complete these courses with a grade of "C" or better may receive transfer credit. The receiving university will determine whether the courses will count as general education, pre-major, elective credit, or none.

CAREER TECHNICAL Certificate Quick Reference

Requirements:

- Junior or senior
- At least 3.0 weighted high school GPA or recommendation of principal
- Complete SCC paper application for high school students
- Textbooks and other required materials must be purchased by the student (or high school)
- Student / parent are responsible for transportation to / from seat-based classes

When a student completes ALL courses in a pathway, he or she may take other classes required for the diploma or degree.

Students may be in a College Transfer Pathway AND Career Technical Certificate, or two Career Technical Certificates.

Courses may be taken in any order, except courses with required prerequisites.

No course substitutions are allowed.

To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must: (1) continue to make progress toward high school graduation and (2) maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework.

Cosmetology Diploma – This pathway does NOT meet the licensure hour requirement to sit for the state board exam. Students must complete additional courses, after high school graduation, before taking the state exam.

SCC Cosmetology Department will lend high school students a textbook and "working kit." Students must purchase (or already have) black "scrubs," black socks and black, closed-toed shoes to wear to class every day. Students must also purchase malpractice insurance for \$17 before they may work on clients in the lab.
