



NEW! Carolina Student Transfer Excellence Program

(CSTEP) " Helping low-and moderate- income students on their path to success"

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's Carolina Student Transfer Excellence Program (C-STEP) and Southwestern Community College (SCC) in Sylva are partnering to increase the number of students transferring to and graduating from UNC-Chapel Hill. SCC is the 11th community college to partner with C-STEP and Carolina.

Through C-STEP, low- and moderate-income high school and community college students who enroll in one of the program's partner colleges are guaranteed admission to UNC-Chapel Hill if they are first admitted to and successfully complete the community college portion of the program with at least a 3.2 GPA.

"Every day we have the chance to see our students grow and challenge themselves as they build success-

"The launch of C-STEP at SCC will create even more opportunities for our students, their families and our community."

Now in its 12th year, C-STEP was launched with the support of the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation in an effort to enable more community college students to transfer to and graduate from UNC-Chapel Hill. Almost 800 transfer students enter UNC-Chapel Hill each year, about 33 percent from North Carolina community colleges.

"North Carolina community college transfer students are an amazing group of scholars," said Rebecca Egbert, C-STEP program director. "Working with Southwestern Community College students as they prepare to come to Carolina and once they've arrived in Chapel Hill will be a privilege. These students enrich our campus with their experience, diligence and intelligence."

Students who participate in C-STEP agree to earn an appropriate associate degree at their partner community college and participate actively in the program, which offers students special events, advising and transition and support services both at their home college and at UNC-Chapel Hill. The program also provides transition and support services once students have enrolled at UNC-Chapel Hill and are pursuing bachelor's degrees.

C-STEP currently serves almost 845 students; 652 of those have already enrolled at UNC-Chapel Hill and 482 have graduated. The remaining students are expected to enroll after completing their community college courses. As of 2018, the average C-STEP graduate GPA is 3.0. The overall graduation rate is 81 percent.

Fundraiser to support student scholarships

Over 4 years, annual SCC gala raises more than \$250,000.

Since moving its annual gala to Harrah's Cherokee Casino Resort in 2015, the Southwestern Community College Foundation has raised more than a guarter-of-a-million dollars.

As has been the case annually since its inception, the current year's gala yielded more money than the last. "Bluegrass, Blue Jeans & Bling," which was held on Aug. 25, netted more than \$72,000 when factoring in table sponsorships, silent auction sales, wine pull proceeds and individual tickets. money raised goes toward support-All SCC students through scholarships. ing

"None of our success with the gala would be possible without the generosity and support from our good friends at Harrah's," said Dr. Don Tomas, SCC President. "We are incredibly blessed to live in a region filled with kind and generous people who understand how Southwestern benefits our communities, and they're always willing to step up with amazing levels of financial support. We cannot thank all our sponsors and donors enough.

"We also could not have done this without the help of all our volunteers," Dr. Tomas added. "Our cochairs, Wendy LeMay and Lambert Wilson, once

again did an amazing job of coordinating this gala. It takes a tremendous amount of work to make these events successful, and I deeply appreciate all the hard work that's done behind the scenes."

At this year's gala, attendees heard from scholarship recipients MaShon Gaddis and Yesenia Navarro. Gaddis is a current student while Navarro graduated in May. Each spoke briefly about how significant an impact their scholarships have made on their lives.

Thanks in part to the recent successful galas, the Foundation is experiencing unprecedented growth – and is able to help more students each year. However, there is still much work to do. The Foundation's total assets have more than doubled since Dr. Tomas became president in 2011 and currently stand at \$5,555,028.11.

During the 2017 gala, SCC celebrated the completion of its first million-dollar endowment. And as the Foundation continues to gather fundraising momentum, the college is able to support more students than ever.

"Harrah's Cherokee Casino Resort is happy to partner with SCC, working together to be leaders in the efforts to raise funds for education," said Brooks Robinson, Regional Senior Vice Pres-



ident and General Manager of Harrah's Cherokee Properties. "Many employees and their family members have participated in the programs offered at SCC. We are proud of the work they do in making our communities stronger, and we look forward to continuing our partnership." Total amount of scholarships awarded in 2013-14 was \$51,355. This year's scholarship value was \$132,000 - and that's in addition to the more than \$36,000 that was awarded to New Century Scholars. The Foundation also was able to provide \$4,500 to students in need through the Student Emergency Fund.

Five years ago, the SCC Foundation was only able to help one out of every five students (42 out of 225) who applied for financial assistance. For the current academic year, SCC was able to assist one out of every three (93 out of 268).

But that still means two of every three gualified applicants aren't receiving assistance.

"We've come a long way, and that has everything to do with the generous spirit of our donors throughout Jackson, Macon, Swain Counties and the Qualla Boundary," said Brett Woods, Director of the SCC Foundation. "We aim to continue building on this momentum until we're able to provide financial assistance to every student who can use a hand up so that they can change their lives through the academic programs at Southwestern."

NEW! Health Sciences Building

EDA awards \$2 million to SCC to help with construction of a new health sciences building!





ment of Commerce's Economic Development Administration has awarded a grant worth \$2,015,395 to Southwestern Community College and Jackson County.

The new workforce training facility, which will be located on SCC's Jackson Campus, is on schedule to be completed in spring of 2021. It will allow SCC to admit 144 additional students in each of the first two years after the building opens, and the project is expected to create 236 new jobs within Jackson, Macon, Swain Counties and the Qualla Boundary.

"We are honored and excited that the EDA chose to help fund our project," said Dr. Don Tomas, President of SCC. "Our new health sciences building is a huge economic development opportunity for our region. There's a tremendous need for more healthcare professionals. A number of long-term care facilities have beds available right now, but they can't accept more patients because there aren't enough qualified individuals available to provide the necessary care. Our new facility will help change that."

In addition to the EDA grant, other funding sources for construction include the Connect NC Bond and the Jackson County one-fourth-of-a-penny referendum, both of which were passed by voters in 2016. Connect NC will contribute approximately \$5.4 million, and Jackson County's investment will be between approximately \$12.3 and \$14.4 million – depending on bids.

"Investment in this new health sciences building is really an investment in our people, both locally and regionally," said Don Adams, Jackson County Manager. "The educational opportunities that will be made available through this new facility will empower our citizens to improve the quality of their lives for generations.


SCC needs the new building as it has outgrown the Balsam Center, which was built in 1988 to accommodate four healthcare training programs. Southwestern now has 14 health sciences programs, and the new building will allow for three more once approved by the state.

The proposed three-level building will be 55,411 square feet. It will house 23 classrooms and labs, and many of the college's health sciences programs will offer free community clinics. Among those are Physical Therapist Assistant, Occupational Therapy Assistant and Medical Sonography.
