

Dear Prospective PTA student:

Thank you for your interest in our PTA program. We accept 16 students each fall. It is important that you read and understand all of the requirements and the point system used to score your application in order to give you the optimum opportunity to be considered for admission to the program.

ALL program admissions requirements must be complete and received by the Admissions office by March 1, 2022 in order for your application to be reviewed:

- If you are not currently enrolled at SCC, complete an application to the college. Designate PTA AAS Degree (A45620) as the program of interest. If you are a current student who does not have your program of interest listed as PTA AAS, please see Admissions to complete a change of major form.
- You need to have at least a **2.75 GPA** minimum from the last 10 hours of college credits that you were enrolled in, or as your cumulative high school GPA.
- Submit all transcripts for high school and college(s) listed on your application. Transfer credit cannot be evaluated without official transcripts sent directly to the Admission office.
- You must have completed all developmental course work if this is required based on placement testing.
- You need to take the ATI-TEAS exam (information available at https://www.southwesterncc.edu/testing-center/ati-teas-exam). A minimum score of 60 is required.
- You must have completed **ACA 111** if you have less than 10 hours of college credit.
- Current high school students graduating by May will be considered for conditional acceptance to the program.

PTA Program Application Criteria and Scoring

After March 1st: our admissions office will send the PTA faculty all information on applicants who have completed the above criteria. We will base our final decision on the 16 candidates chosen based on the following 250-point criteria:
