SEASONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING (SLET)

The Seasonal Law Enforcement Training (SLET) program is designed to prepare the Seasonal Law Enforcement Park Ranger to perform limited law enforcement duties during seasonal employment with the National Park Service. Successful graduates of the Seasonal Law Enforcement Training (SLET) program are eligible to receive a Type II Seasonal Law Enforcement Commission.

The Type II Seasonal Law Enforcement Commission will be issued by the appropriate Park Superintendent upon assignment and will be surrendered to the Superintendent at the completion of the seasonal employment. Commissions may be reissued for subsequent periods of employment upon certification that required annual training has been met by the Seasonal Law Enforcement Park Ranger. The Type II commission enables the bearer to carry firearms, make arrests, investigate violations of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFRs), investigate motor vehicle accidents (excluding fatalities), initiate reports for felonies and fatalities, assist during follow-up investigations under the supervision and direction of an Law Enforcement Park Ranger with a Type I (Permanent) law enforcement commission, serve subpoenas and assist in the serving of Warrants under the immediate direction of an Law Enforcement Park Ranger with a Type I law enforcement commission.
