

REFUND POLICY

Registration fee refunds are granted only under the following circumstances:

- A student who officially withdraws from an extension class(es) prior to the first class meeting shall be eligible for a 100 percent refund. Also, a student is eligible for a 100-percent refund if an applicable class is canceled.
- After the respective class begins a 75-percent refund shall be made upon the request of the student if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10-percent point of the scheduled hours of the class. Note: This rule is applicable regardless of the number of times the class meets or the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet.
- A 100-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class prior to the first day of class of the academic semester or term or if the college cancels the class. A 75-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class on or before the tenth calendar day of the class.
- Self-supporting classes are not eligible for refunds.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT

For occupational extension classes, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are allowed. One CEU may be given for each 10 contact hours of participation in class.

"With gas prices as high as they are right now, we wanted to find some way to make our courses more accommodating," Marley said. "Just getting everything set up for one of our pottery classes can take each student 30 minutes or more each time we have a class, so having a six-hour workshop on a single day makes a lot more sense than having a class that meets three different times for two hours each session."

Marley is also offering more classes than has been possible in recent pandemic-affected years, and he's trying to provide more Friday and Saturday options for folks who work the rest of the week.

He's also scheduled more beginner classes for individuals who want to get started and explore what Heritage Arts are all about.

"We know that a lot of people are interested in the arts and have always wanted to try their hand at drawing, painting or working with clay - but it can be intimidating to start something new," Marley said. "We want to make it easy for you to discover how much fun Heritage Arts can be."



Coursework includes instruction in general studies, biomedical sciences, dental sciences, clinical sciences, and clinical practice. Graduates may be eligible to sit for the Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) exam through the Dental Assisting National Board once all requirements are met, including 3000 hours of chairside assisting.

Dental Assisting Part 2 Course Code: DEN-3300 Course Hours: 210

This 11-week continuation of Part 1 includes the completion of Part 1 coursework, prepares the student for success in the healthcare field, and includes a clinical externship. Completion of Part 1 is required.

Veterinary Receptionist Course Code: MED 3300 Course Hours: 270

This 14-week, on-line training program through Career Step will allow you to gain the skills needed to work as a medical office assistant in any type of medical facility. Students will gain knowledge in Microsoft Office, Business Writing, Animal Safety, Client Management, Patient Management, Pharmacy and Pharmacology, Laboratory and Surgical Procedures, Medical Law and Ethics, Medical Office Procedures, Basic Anatomy, and Medical Office Management. This program prepares students to sit for the CMAA (Certified Medical Administrative Assistant) certification exam.

Pharmacy Technician Part I Course Code: PHM 3250 Course Hours: 213

This course will prepare students to find employment (and success) as a pharmacy technician in a healthcare or retail setting. Emphasis is placed on a variety of duties within the pharmacy environment including: computer fundamentals, basic anatomy, pharmacology, pharmacy law, regulations and standards, pharmacy calculations and prescriptions.

Pharmacy Technician Part II Course Code: MED 3300 Course Hours: 281

This course will prepare students to find employment (and success) as a pharmacy technician in a healthcare or retail setting. Emphasis is placed on community pharmacy practice, institutional pharmacy practice, virtual pharmacy labs, final exam prep and includes a required 130 hour externship. Students must complete all of the course modules in part one and part two, pass the final exam, and complete the 130 hour externship to be eligible to earn a passing grade and certificate for the Pharmacy Technician course. This course is approved by ASHP and students will be eligible to take the PTCB exam with this training.


