REFUND POLICY

Registration fee refunds are granted only under the following circumstances:

- A student who officially withdraws from an extension class(es) prior to the first class meeting shall be eligible for a 100 percent refund. Also, a student is eligible for a 100-percent refund if an applicable class is canceled.
- After the respective class begins a 75-percent refund shall be made upon the request of the student if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10-percent point of the scheduled hours of the class. Note: This rule is applicable regardless of the number of times the class meets or the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet.
- A 100-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class prior to the first day of class of the academic semester or term or if the college cancels the class. A 75-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class on or before the tenth calendar day of the class.
- Self-supporting classes are not eligible for refunds.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT

For occupational extension classes, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are allowed. One CEU may be given for each 10 contact hours of participation in class.





Starting a business is a big step for anyone, but starting one from a different state is another matter entirely.

Originally from New Hampshire, Erin Tuveson fell in love with Western North Carolina, where she worked in outdoor adventure programs for over a decade. After returning to New Hampshire, she took on the role as the manager of a local hostel. Continually feeling inspired by the Appalachian Trail, that's when she got the idea to start Rambling Roots Hostel - a place for Appalachian Trail thru-hikers and travelers to stay while exploring the Nantahala Gorge.

Tuveson reached out to Southwestern Community College's Small Business Center, and Director Marne Harris was more than willing to take on the challenge, which ultimately resulted in her receiving the Business Success Story – Business Start-Up award for the 2024 Excellence Awards of the North Carolina Small Business Center Network.

"The journey to launching Rambling Roots Hostel is a true testament to the power of passion,

perseverance and collaboration," said Harris. "It's stories like these that exemplify the mission of Southwestern's Small Business Center – empowering entreprenuers to turn their visions into reality."

Harris collaborated with Small Business Center counselor Sharon Oxendine to help Tuveson over the course of 14 counseling sessions. Through these sessions, assistance was

given with loan packaging, financial projections, marketing strategies and community connections.

"The first time I reached out to Erin to discuss her business plan and model, I was so impressed with her passion and vigor for life," said Oxendine.

Over the span of 14 months, Harris and Oxendine assisted Tuveson in creating a business plan and obtaining a loan, which was secured in November of 2023. That December, she made the move from New Hampshire to Bryson City to live, work and build Rambling Roots Hostel, which opened in August of 2024.

"I wouldn't be where I am today without the guidance of Sharon at the Small Business Center. She was a wealth of knowledge and support during a time where I had lost hope in ever making my dream a reality," said Tuveson. "Having someone in the area who knew and understood the challenges and benefits of opening a business in a small and tight knit community was integral to how I approached my business plan."

On receiving the award, Harris added: "We

are honored to have played a role in Erin's remarkable success and to be recognized with a state excellence award for our efforts."





Hosted by Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO) in Cherokee

In a continued partnership with the Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO) in Cherokee, Southwestern Community College has started a class that trains students how to build a tiny house.

The class, which began on Jan. 22, consists of 20 students who are all working together to build the structure. The group started out by developing floor plans and practicing plumbing and electrical work.

The partnership between SCC and TERO allows enrolled members of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) to receive training that could help meet workforce needs in the Qualla Boundary.

Student tuition has been covered by SCC, and TERO covered the material costs.

"We're excited to start our second class in partnership with TERO and the EBCI," said Scott Sutton, Dean of Workforce Continuing Education at SCC. "The skills these students gain will lead to stable, fulfilling employment for everyone willing to learn, put in the time and work hard. I'm personally very excited to see the progress as this class builds a tiny house from the foundation all the way until the last shingle is nailed onto the roof."

Through new Dogwood funding, SCC leads effort to improve high-speed Internet access & computer literacy

A new collaborative of five organizations in Jackson, Macon and Swain counties and the Qualla Boundary were selected to participate in Dogwood Health Trust's Elevate Digital Collaborative, which focuses on making broadband internet available, affordable and useful for everyone in Western North Carolina. They join nine other collaboratives doing similar work in Western North Carolina for the initiative.

"Reliable internet access is no longer a luxury—it's a necessity for education, employment, and everyday life," said Tiffany Henry, Director of Economic Development for Jackson County. "Through this initiative, we're taking meaningful steps to remove barriers and ensure that more residents in Jackson County and beyond can fully participate in today's digital world. We're proud to work alongside our partners to create lasting impact."

Nearly 50 organizations are part of the Elevate Digital Collaborative across the 18 counties and Qualla Boundary of Western North Carolina. Together, they'll lead local efforts to build sustainable community partnerships, develop local leadership to champion digital inclusion, and support workforce development and economic growth through improved connectivity.

"Our collaborative partners are deeply embedded in their communities and uniquely positioned to move solutions forward," said Sarah Thompson, Vice President for Economic Opportunity at Dogwood Health Trust. "Through collaboration and action, we'll build a stronger, healthier and more prosperous region."

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
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
