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## **I. TRANSFER OF EARNED CREDIT**

Applicants to degree, diploma, or certificate programs who want credit for course work completed at other post-secondary institutions are responsible for having an official transcript from each institution submitted directly to the Director of Student Records/Registrar's office. Courses with a grade of "C" or higher may be accepted if the courses are applicable to the program selected at this College and were earned at an accredited college, university, community college, or technical institute.

Credits transferred to the College from another institution will be recognized as hours toward the appropriate degree, diploma, or certificate, but will not be calculated toward the cumulative grade point average (GPA) for that program.

All official transcripts submitted to the Director of Student Records/Registrar's office will be evaluated for transfer credit before registration if possible.

Transfer of "Credit by Exam" will not exceed more than one-half of degree requirements and must be approved by the dean or coordinator of the appropriate program.

## **II. PREVIOUSLY EARNED CREDIT**

Course work completed in technical areas or programs of study leading to licensure may be subject to review and approval of the respective Program Coordinator and/or Dean. General education credit beyond ten (10) years may be subject to Dean and/or departmental review. In some cases, credit may be awarded if the student passes a competency test (see "Course Credit by Exam" Policy 6.02.10). The age of course work is reviewed for both previously earned credit at the College and course work being transferred into the College.

## **III. COURSE CREDIT IN RESIDENCE**

In order for an Associate Degree to be awarded: (a) a minimum of twenty-five (25) percent of total course work; and (b) a minimum of twenty-five (25) percent of required major courses in the degree program must be completed in residence at the College. Certain diploma and certificate programs require less credit to meet residency requirements. These programs will be determined on an individual basis by the Executive Vice President for Instruction and Student Services.
